Coronavirus

We are aware that some parents and families may be concerned about the potential impact the spread of this virus may have on school and how we plan to deal with this. In addition, our children have been learning about handwashing, as well as respiratory (breathing, sneezing etc) health to help combat the spread of colds and viruses. We are actively encouraging (as you could also at home) our children to wash their hands thoroughly in hot soapy water frequently during the day. We will adapt our teaching to follow any further advice that may come, for example if we are advised to not handshake or hug, we may teach the children about fist or elbow bumps instead.
