At Much Wooltor Catholic Primary School we necognise that the personal development of our pupils, spinitually, monally, socially and culturally plays a significant part in their ability to learn and achieve. We therefore aim to provide an education that provides children with opportunities to explone and develop: their awn values and beliefs; spinitual amaneness; high standands of behaviour; a positive caning altitude tomands others; an undenstanding of their social and cultural traditions and an appreciation of the diversity and richness of other cultures.

All Curriculum aneas have a contribution to make to the child's SMSC development and oppontunities, for this where possible will be planned in to curriculum areas.

Collective morship will allom children to explone thein own spinituality and mill focus on monal values, and the Catholic Faith, whilst building resilience to extremist wiews. (see also Collective Worship Policy)

All adults will model and promote expected behaviour treating all people as valuable individuals and shoming respect for pupils and their families, (see also. Dignity at Work Policy) Children should learn to differentiate between night and wnong and undenstand how their actions can affect others. In addition to modelled behaviour, PSHE lessons will also add to the teaching of SMSC which takes, the form of lessons in Citizenship, British Values, and Personal and Social Skills. These sessions are timetabled weekly for I hour.

Our School rules promote responsible behaviour and high expectations. These were written by our pupils for our pupils. They ane displayed anound the school and on both of our playgrounds.

Spinitual Development: We aim to ensure that children -

- Develop their capacity for critical and independent thought.
-Sustain their self - esteem throughout thein learning experiences.
- Experience moments of stillness and reflection to contemplate their Christian faith.
-Discuss, their beliefs, feelings, values and responses to pensonal experiences.
Form and maintain positive relationships.
Reflect on, consider and celebrate the monders and mysteries of life.

Monal Development: We aim to ensure that children -
Recognise the unique value of each individual
Lister and respond appropriately to the wiews of others.

Gain the confidence to cope mith setbacks and learn from mistakes.
-Take initiative and act responsibly with consideration for others.
-Distinguish betweer right and wrong.

- Show respect for the environment.
- Make informed and independent choices.
. Understand and respond to injustice.

Social Development: We aim to ensure that children -
Develop an understanding of thein individual and group identity.
.Help others withir school and the mider community.

Cultural development: We cim to ensure that children -
Recognise the walue and richness of cultural diversity in our area, the wider community and the world.

Practical Activities to develop SMSC:
Co-operative learning - work together in different groupings and situations. This mill provide opportunities for childnen to: lister and talk to each other; develop ar amareness of others, treating them as equals; learn to agree and disagnee, experience good note models.
-Talking Partners during lessons. (usually these are mixed ability)
-Allocating responsibilities to childner.
Encouraging teammork across the curriculum where relevant.

- Allom time for children to shom appreciation for the achievements of others.

Listening to music from a range of composers on from different countries. Opportunities in music for childner to listen to and learn songs on play instruments from other cultures.
Listening to stories on studying literature from other cultures.
Learn about hom famous people have contributed to society.
