Welcome Back

We are really looking forward to welcoming all of our children back to school on Monday 8th March. Entrance and Exit procedures will revert back to the way that they were prior to Christmas, with the children using their identified gate and their previously allocated drop off and collection times. The children will remain in their class bubbles, breaks and lunchtimes will continue to be staggered.

In order to ensure that our staff, children and their families remain safe we are asking you to please adhere to all government guidelines when dropping off and collecting your children. All children will need to be left at the school gates in the morning and only **1** adult will be allowed on the school site at the end of the day to collect their child. Unless you are exempt, masks must be worn when collecting children and a 2m distance from staff and other parents should be observed. Parents should not stay to chat to others on the playground or outside the school grounds.

When the children return to school, staff will spend time identifying gaps in knowledge and a recovery curriculum will be delivered to ensure that our children's key skills and knowledge in phonics, reading, writing and mathematics continue to be developed. Staff will not talk about 'catch up work' or the need to 'catch up' as we feel that this will put our children under undue pressure and may lead to them feeling anxious. All children across the country have missed out on so much over the last year - educationally, socially and emotionally and, as a school, we are just grateful that they are all able to return to school safe and well. It will be lovely to see their faces once more and to hear their laughter and chatter. Skills and knowledge will come.




Fundraising


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



Home Learning

Each week we will be displaying some of the work the children have completed either in school or at home. Take a look at some of the fantastic work the children have produced.












Wellbeing Wednesdays


