Religious Education



This term we are continuing with the topic 'Belonging'. We will be exploring Baptism and how it enables people to belong to God's family in a special way. We will then be moving on to 'Waiting'. This involves us learning all about Advent, a time of waiting to celebrate Jesus' coming at Christmas.

Physical Education

In our PE lessons we will be focussing on the skills used in gymnastics. We will be investigating different body movements, looking at language like wide, narrow, curling and rolling. We will also be looking at different ways we can balance. We will also be taking part in dance, which will use our body to express simple theme related shapes, movements and feelings.

Design Technology

This half term we will be designing, making and evaluating our own moving story book whilst looking at and evaluating different mechanisms.

English

In English we will be focussing on two novels. Foggy,

story settings and descriptions.





Maths

Our Maths learning will include...

- Comparing height and length
- Measuring height and length

History

In our topic work we will be exploring 'Toys in Time.' We will be comparing toys from the past with those of today. If any parents or grandparents still have any of their old toys it would be great to share them with the class.

Science

In Science we will be looking at the seasons Autumn and Winter. We will be discussing and investigating the changes we can see from Autumn to Winter and what happens to plants and animals during these seasons.
