

Year 6, Unit 1: Ancient Greece

This is the final world civilisation which took place at the same time as Ancient Egypt, Ancient Maya, and Bronze and Iron Age Britain, allowing pupils to make further chronological links. Placing this unit in Year 6 allows topics like democracy to be explored in depth.

Year 6, Unit 2: Conflict and Resolution

This introduces pupils to modern history and teaches pupils about the First World War and the Second World War.

Year 5, Unit 3: Baghdad and the Middle East

This is the third world civilisation unit studied in History. This period overlaps with the same time period as the Ancient Maya, allowing pupils to make chronological links.

Year 4, Unit 3: Maya Civilisation

Pupils learn about their second civilisation from outside of British history. Chronological connections can be made with Ancient Egypt.

Year 5, Unit 2: Vikings

This time period overlaps with the Anglo-Saxon period when Vikings first began to invade, raid, and settle in Britain. It includes the unification of England and ends with the start of the Norman period in 1066.

Year 4, Unit 2: Roman Britain

After being introduced to the Romans and their invasion of Britain in the previous unit, pupils then learn about life in Britain under Roman rule.

Year 5, Unit 1: Anglo-Saxons and Scots

This time period follows Roman Britain and deals with the early Anglo-Saxon period up to the time of King Alfred.

Year 4, Unit 1: The Romans

The Roman conquest of Britain marks the end of the Iron Age, so pupils are first introduced to the Romans and the Roman invasion of Britain here.

Year 3, Unit 2: Ancient Egypt

In this unit pupils learn about a civilisation that existed during the same time period as later prehistoric British civilisations.

Year 2, Unit 2: Kings and Queens

Pupils investigate a range of monarchs outside living memory alongside the current royal family.

Year 2, Unit 3: People Who

Pupils investigate the lives of significant people both nationally and internationally.

Year 3, Unit 1: Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages

In Key Stage 2, history splits into two strands. Here, pupils first learn about British history by looking at the three prehistoric periods.

Year 2, Unit 1: The Great Fire of London

This is the first unit where pupils study history outside of living memory.

Year 1, Unit 2: Transport and Travel

Pupils investigate the changes of transport over time and investigate transport in their local area.

Year 1, Unit 1: Toys in Time

Pupils investigate changes in toys within living memory.
