PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

PE with Mr Hathaway - Speed, Agility & Travel

- · Participate in a variety of agility-based activities.
- Recognise the difference between actions such as: moving softly, quietly, quickly, powerfully, etc

Gross Motor

- Den building and developing mud play.
- Combine different movements with ease and fluency by exploring and creating obstacle courses.
- · Encourage children to be highly active and get out of breath

Fine Motor

Develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient by:

- · Continue to develop letter formation
- Use a range of small apparatus eg. paint brushes
- Developing cutting skills and using scissors correctly

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

Topic Based

- Learn and use new vocabulary through a range of traditional tales.
- Answer 'why' and 'how do you know' questions.
- Retelling stories with an increased knowledge of story language.
- Make up their own stories with beginning, middle and end.
- Engage in story times with increased attention.
- Listen and talk about stories to build familiarity and build to story retelling.
- Use new vocabulary in different contexts.

PSED

- Begin to set our own goals and show resilience in the face of a challenge.
- · Share experiences of work and play.
- Discuss how we treat others including people we know and others less fortunate.
- Discussing the zones of emotional regulation and how we can overcome feelings such as frustration.
- Continue to manage their own needs by becoming more independent eg. toileting, changing, eating and handwashing.

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SPECIFIC AREAS

LITERACY

- Continue to review set I sounds and learn set 2 sounds in Phonics.
- Exploring story telling and vocabulary through 'Talk Through Stories'.
- Read and write common exception words.
- Continue to develop pencil grip and correct letter formation.
- Develop sentence writing by using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.
- Read decodable books and retell well known stories.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Through our theme of traditional tales children will be exploring the world around them...

- Explore how traditions are passed on and what traditions different people celebrate.
- Special people in their lives as well as public figures eg.
 The King.
- Castles now and then.
