The Statue of Liberty is in the **harbour** of New York City, New York.

The statue is 46 metres tall and holds a torch.


The torch represents light being in the world and the broken chains at the statue's feet symbolise freedom of the people.





Mount Rushmore is a mountain with huge faces carved into it in South Dakota.


The faces are of four former presidents of the USA: George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln, and Theodore Roosevelt.







The Space Needle is an observation tower in Seattle, Washington. The tower is 184 metres tall and was opened to the public in 1962.



The Hoover Dam is located on the border between Nevada and Arizona.

It is used to control floods, to create hydroelectric power, for irrigation (transporting water to farms), and to supply houses with the water they need.

The dam is 221 metres tall and 379 metres long.
