The letters 'ee' make a long vowel sound like in the word see. This is a common way of spelling the sound and is found in the middle of words and sometimes at the end.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Learn for a test on 18.11.25</p> <p>Spelling Rules: The vowel digraph 'er'. In these words the sound is stressed.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Learn for a test on 20.11.25</p> <p>Spelling Rules: The vowel digraph 'er'. In these words the sound is unstressed and found at the end of words.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Learn for a test on 27.11.25</p> <p>Spelling Rules: The ai digraph.
