Year 6 Autumn Term 2 November - December 2025

Religious Education

<u>Advent/Christmas - Loving: Hope -</u> Advent is a time when we appreciate the love in our lives and prepare to celebrate love becoming a reality in the person of Jesus. Christians at Christmas celebrate the gift of Jesus, given by God as a sign and expression of God's love

PSHE/RSHE

Pupils will understand ways to take care of their physical wellbeing. They will learn the importance of resilience and develop strategies to help with this. Pupils will also explore habits and how these can be good and bad for our health.

Science

<u>Classification</u> - this topic will expand pupil's knowledge of living things and their habitats by exploring classification in detail. Pupils build on their knowledge from Year 4 and will begin the unit by learning about the significance of Carl Linnaeus' pioneering work in classification.

Physical Education

<u>Fitness</u> - Pupils will be taught about and develop different aspects of fitness including strength, stamina, balance, agility, speed and flexibility

<u>Dance</u> - Pupils will focus on developing an idea or theme into a dance choreography. They will work in small groups using different choreography tools to create dances.



Mathematics

For this half term we will be revisiting some of the fraction work covered in Year 5. Midway through the term the pupils will moving onto learning about multiplying and dividing fractions. It is important that pupils complete their maths homework to support their class learning and that any pupils who are not fluent in their timetables practise using Doodle tables.

English

This term the pupils will be reading 'Who Let the Gods Out' and writing a narrative related to the story. This will extend the pupil's understanding of effective narrative writing by analysing and writing each of the five parts of a narrative text opening, buildup, dilemma, events and resolution/ending and supporting the pupils when writing their own narrative.

Geography

Mapping the World - This unit focuses on developing pupils' mapreading skills and expanding their knowledge of human and physical geography. Pupils will explore different types of maps, including political, physical, and thematic maps, and learn to use 6figure grid references. Practical fieldwork in the local area will allow pupils to apply their skills, understand land use, and examine its connection to climate zones, fostering a deeper understanding of geography's role in addressing global challenge

<u>Design Technology</u>

Come Dine With Me_- Pupils will develop a three-course menu focused on three key ingredients, as part of a paired challenge to develop the best class recipes. Explore each key ingredient's farm to fork process.

Music

Children will be continuing with their weekly singing lessons. They will be learning and rehearsing a range of carols in the preparation for Advent and Christmas.

Homework - Homework will follow the same schedule as the previous term. Pupils are expected to complete 3 Reading Plus lessons throughout the weeks however, we encourage more for additional practice. Pupils are expected to remain on target on Doodle Maths, which equates to earning roughly 50 stars (50 questions answered correctly) each week. A gentle reminder that spelling tests take place each Friday. Children should focus on the spelling rule for each weeks.
