<p>Learn for a test on 8th January</p> <p>The short vowel sound 'oo' as in foot. Standard English pronunciation has been used here. In some parts of England the -ook words may have a longer sound.</p>	<p>Learn for a test on 15th January</p> <p>The long vowel sound /i/ spelt 'igh'. This is usually found in the middle of words but sometimes at the end of words too.</p>	<p>Learn for a test on 22nd January</p> <p>The /or/ sound. The vowel digraph 'or' and trigraph 'ore'. It is more likely that when at the end of a word then it will be spelled with an 'e'.</p>	<p>Learn for a test on 29th January</p> <p>The digraphs 'ir' and 'ur'. Often found in the middle of words and occasionally at the beginning of words.</p>	<p>Learn for a test on 5th February</p> <p>The 'oa' digraph can come at the beginning or in the middle of words but very rarely at the end. The 'oe' digraph can be sometimes found at the end of words.</p>	<p>12th February</p>
