RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Our next RE topic is titled 'Desert to Garden' and we will be learning about the season of Lent as a time to prepare for Easter. We will learn about the story of the last week of Jesus' life, his death and resurrection. Pupils will experience Lent traditions as part of our school's prayer life.

PHONICS

Children will continue with the Read, write, Inc. phonics scheme. They will be taught all the sounds to help them read words. They will also be taught how to segment words to spell.

ENGLISH

This half term we will begin by focussing on punctuating our sentences using the story 'The Full Stop That Got Away' by Laura Baker to support our learning. During our whole school picture book week we will explore the not so traditional tale of 'Little Red' by Bethan Woolvin. We will then spend 3 weeks using 'Giraffes Can't Dance' by Giles Andreae to inspire our writing. Our writing focus will be to continue becoming independent writers as well as improving our letter formation and presentation of writing.



SCIENCE

In Science we will be continuing with our topic all about animals. We will be looking at what animals eat and grouping them into herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. We will be thinking about what animals make good pets and why. Finally, we will learn the basic human body parts and their functions.



MATHS

- Solve word problems using a variety of visual aids and manipulatives.
- We will be putting into practice concepts previously taught in number comparison, specifically looking at how many more or how many fewer/less.
- We will learn the foundations of equal groupings, repeated addition, arrays and doubling.



HISTORY

We will begin by looking at travel today, the types of transport that are used in the local area and other things that help us to travel around safely, such as traffic lights and road signs. We will try to recognise the modes of transport available today and then compare them to modes of transports from the past. We will then predict how we think transport might change and how we think transport will look in the future.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

In PE the children will be exploring invasion games and target games. They will be working on changing speed, stopping safely moving into space and their own spatial awareness. They will also be focussing on aiming and accuracy, rolling a ball with control and throwing underarm towards a target.

PSHE - our topic for this half term is citizenship. We will think about how we can care for animals and the needs of others and think about peoples differences.
