English

In English this half term, the children in Year 6 will be focusing on developing their independent writing skills and consolidating GPS.

Pupils will enjoy writing for a range of purposes this term in relation to our class novel 'Kofi and the Rap Battle Summer'. We will look at writing a rap, thinking about rhyme, rhythm and assonance, and also a first-person narrative inspired by the events of the novel.

Science

Pupils will add to their existing knowledge of 'Animals Including Humans'. They will work scientifically to look at the impact external factors have on our bodies such as nutrients and exercise.

Additionally, our 'Electricity' topic will explore the differences between parallel and series circuits developing the pupils understanding electricity as a concept.

Computing

Big Data - Pupils will be taught to create their own QR code using a QR code generator website. They will also complete spreadsheets using real-time data, presenting the data collected as an answer to a question.

Mathematics

This half term, children will consolidate knowledge and build on previous mathematical skills. Pupils will focus on more reasoning and problem-solving, styled questions and complete multi-step problems.

Religious Education

Children will learn about the importance of Healing. They will discuss, explore, describe and make links to beliefs, stories and scripture throughout the topic.

The final topic will be Common Good. At the heart of this is respect for the human person made in the image of God; social well-being and development; peace between all people; understanding of the equality of all; and an awareness of being part of God's global family.

Physical Education

This term, the children in Year 6 will be participating in cricket and rounders lessons. They will be taught to apply strength and flexibility to a broad range of throwing, batting and fielding activities. They will also work in collaboration and demonstrate improvement when working with self and others.

RSHE

Journey in Love - Children will continue to understand what stable, caring relationships are. Focusing on Catholic teaching, children will also understand about the conception of a child within marriage.

PSHE and No Outsiders - Children will focus on Economic Wellbeing and Global Learning in PSHE this term. Children will also cover diversity through No Outsiders.

Music

In Music, we will continue working with the Archdiocese of Liverpool school's singing programme to develop a range singing techniques.
